Spring Check List - Part 1

In Southern Maryland, spring beekeeping activities focus on preparing hives for the season by checking for disease, food stores, queen health, feeding bees (if needed). Here are a few early spring beekeeping activities:

- √ Anybody Home? Bees flying in and out of the hive indicate a healthy colony.
- √ You Good Girl? Make sure the queen is present and healthy. A productive queen is vital for colony growth.
- √ What's for Dinner? Check for adequate food stores (honey and pollen) to maintain the colony through the spring, especially if the weather turns cold again.
- √ Ya'll Feeling OK? Look for signs of disease, such as Varroa mites, tracheal mites, nosema, chalkbrood & foulbrood. Treat as appropriate.
- √ Spring Cleaning Remove debris and clean the bottom board to foster a healthy hive environment.
- √ Easy Access Remove winter wraps to improve airflow.
