# Tis the Season...

So far, blooms are (at minimum) ten days earlier than normal. The crocus, daffodils, and dandelion as well as red maple are already sending out pollen, therefore we are on the edge of ramping up for the season. Likely the end of March first of April will see us dealing with the beginning of splits and preventing/catching swarms. If you are a beekeeper, get ready! If you are a honey lover or allergy sufferer, we've still got some local honey and stand by for the new late spring harvest. It's right around the corner.
